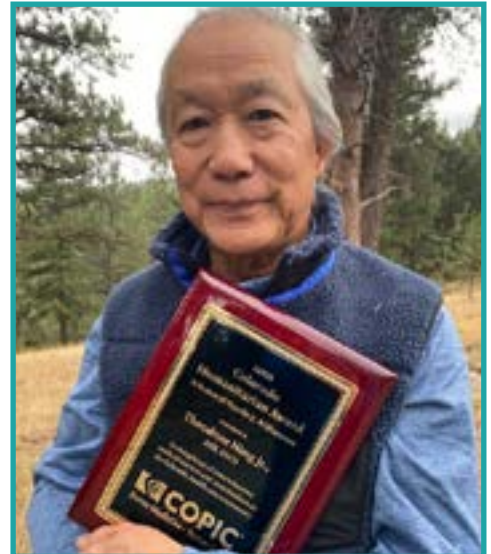
2021 COLORADO COPIC HUMANITARIAN AWARD DR. TED NING

Dr. Ted Ning is a successful urologist who decided to leave his practice at the age of 50 to follow his heart and passion to help others. As a founding and participatory member in a variety of nonprofit organizations, the local and international community has been significantly impacted by Dr. Ning’s vision, strategy, and commitment to addressing social issues.

Beginning in residency, Dr. Ning spent countless volunteer hours working at the Denver Free Clinic and running Operation Baby Lift. After residency, he continued his volunteer efforts by implementing and growing numerous nonprofit organizations. Throughout the years, Dr. Ning has volunteered his time in causes that empower women in impoverished countries like Guatemala and Vietnam.

Additionally, Dr. Ning has served as Founding Board President for Resilience1220, which provides free counseling services to youth ages 12-20 in the mountain communities west of Denver. Through counseling, support groups, and community outreach, Resilience1220 works to raise awareness of the social, emotional, and mental health issues young adults face, and to provide the necessary life skills to create wellness and resiliency in their lives.

The list of Dr. Ning’s volunteer activities, contributions, and recognitions is extensive. For these and many other reasons, COPIC and CMS have selected him as the honoree for the 2021 COPIC Humanitarian Award. Dr. Ted Ning has chosen Resilience1220 as the beneficiary of the \$10,000 donation associated with the award.
