TCC has helped decrease health disparities, inequities, and improved the lives of those negatively impacted by social determinants of health in rural Minnesota. Dr. Bernard truly goes above and beyond in his volunteer efforts and is well deserving of the award. COPIC is thrilled to honor Dr. Bernard as the 2021 COPIC Humanitarian winner, and on his behalf, grant \$10,000 to The Center Clinic.
