



2020 COPIC Humanitarian Award: Dr. Dennis Wolf

We are proud to announce that Dr. Dennis Wolf, a family practitioner in Dickinson, was chosen as the inaugural recipient of COPIC Humanitarian Award in North Dakota. Dr. Wolf is recognized for his passionate approach to health care, going above and beyond to voluntarily serve the health care needs of his community. The award was presented to Dr. Wolf at the North Dakota Medical Association annual meeting in October.

Dr. Dennis Wolf's contributions to his profession and his community illustrate both high public and professional regard for his integrity as an individual and as a physician. Dr. Wolf has worked to provide better access to care in rural areas and has made significant contributions to easing barriers for individuals with disabilities to allow for more fulfilling participation in community life. He has provided leadership in the public health community and has advocated for patients in difficult health insurance-related situations.

Dr. Wolf is recognized for his leadership and commitment to his community, including his volunteer work with the Boy Scouts of America, Dickinson State University, 4H, Home on the Range for Boys, many service clubs and the Mayor's Committee on the Employment of the Handicapped. He was also recognized for his work as a school and community lecturer on health issues, substance abuse, pre-marriage counseling and health care reform. He has served in various capacities in the governance of health facilities

and foundations, as well as community entities such as the chamber of commerce and the state's first dinosaur museum. Dr. Wolf helps his community through charitable contributions of both his time and financial commitments. He works tirelessly on humanitarian issues he believes in and is highly regarded in the community. For these reasons, he was selected as the recipient of the 2020 COPIC Humanitarian Award, an annual award that honors a physician for outstanding volunteer medical services and contributions to his or her community.

Dr. Wolf has chosen ABLE, an organization that serves men and women with intellectual disabilities, to receive the award's \$10,000 donation.
